

FPC Connectors

Mission

As part of the larger FPC Welcome Team, Connectors help extend intentional and personal hospitality to FPC visitors who attend our worship services. Specifically, Connectors intentionally seek out people they do not recognize as regular attendees or members before or after Sunday worship services by initiating conversation, providing additional information about FPC ministries, and/or introducing the visitor(s) to ministry leaders or other members.

Vision

FPC Connectors hope to make our Sundays services look more like Jesus. We want everyone who steps foot in our worship services to say, “Wow, people want to know me here.” What makes a Sunday experience more compelling? One answer is a sincere question with someone who remembers your name and invites you to connect again, whether at next week’s service or another FPC event.

Time Commitment

Each Connector will commit to attending one service (the one you normally attend) for a month each quarter of the year (tri-monthly). For example, if your first rotation is during the month of January you might serve in January – Q1, April – Q2, July – Q3, and October – Q4.

FAQ: What if something comes up and I can’t make one of my scheduled weeks? There will be 9 other people who serve as Connectors for that service, if you’re nice, you can get a replacement.

Task Commitment

It would be best to arrive a little early (and sit closer to the back) and be willing to stay a little after to allow time for conversation with visitors. Each Connector will be asked to:

- Make one meaningful connection with a visitor or “anonymous attendee” before or after service.

FAQ: Couldn’t this be awkward? Not normally, people are generally more open to conversation at church, but we don’t want to be creepy. We will teach you how to avoid being strange in the training, don’t worry. The Welcome Team Training on August 13th will be very important for you to attend!

- Immediately after meeting someone, fill out a short [Google Form](#) that will be sent to the Director of Connections. This helps accomplish several other goals:
 - Foster prayer over visitors
 - Keep Director informed
 - Make other connectors to be aware of visitors with whom a connection has been made
