<u>General purpose of job:</u> Provide a fun, safe, and nurturing learning experience for children in a Christian environment.

Essential duties and responsibilities:

Education and Curriculum

- Assists in implementing curriculum activities and lesson plans that promote children's social, emotional, physical, cognitive and spiritual development. Implements program schedule for the classroom, outdoor time, meals, snacks, and special activities.
- Interact with parents, children, and co-teachers in a positive way. Uses positive guidance techniques consistent with state regulations; counsels children when social, academic or adjustment problems arise.
- Keep accurate and current records of each child's developmental milestones, and reports student accidents, injuries and attendance to the office daily.
- Foster relationships with children, families, and colleagues.

- Supervise children on the playground and in the mini-gym
- Encourage children to engage independently in developmentally appropriate activities
- Provide hygiene care for children (responsibilities include diaper changing, wiping noses, feeding meals and snacks, etc.)
- Helps the lead teacher establish developmentally appropriate room arrangement, décor (themed based bulletin boards), and learning environment in the classroom. Clean classroom and re-stock supplies.
- Has strong working knowledge of Texas Minimum Standards as they pertain to KDO's operations.
- Provides written communication to parents regarding their child through daily reports.
- Other duties as requested by the supervisor

Interactions with Parents, Staff and Director

- Under the direction of the Lead teacher, assist with the implementation of the curriculum and activities.
- Observes, records, and reports to director any significant behavior of children or staff that could adversely affect the quality of care provided.
- Attend staff development meetings and training sessions
- Meet and communicate with lead teacher to plan curriculum for the upcoming week (optional)
- Accepts temporary work assignments in the event other staff is not available such as
 assisting in another classroom or taking full responsibility of the classroom in the absence
 of the lead teacher.
- Coordinate holiday and birthday parties as needed

Health and Safety

- Implements appropriate emergency procedures in the event of fire, tornado, lock down or other emergency situations.
- Administers CPR/First Aid or other appropriate emergency procedures in the event of serious student accidents or emergencies
- Properly maintains educational materials and equipment; ensures that children are using equipment in an appropriate manner.
- Keeps classroom and other play areas safe, neat and clean. Immediately notifies director
 of needed repairs to the building, play area, equipment or toys throughout the facility.
 Ensures that children are not exposed to equipment or situations that could affect their
 health or safety.

- Must meet or exceed state licensing requirements for age and education (State of Texas is 18 with a high school diploma)
- Completed application and background check
- Maintain at least 24 hours of training each year.
