## **Scripture Passages**

Colossians 3:1-2 & 5-8 (NIV) Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. 2 Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things....5 Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desires and greed, which is idolatry. 6 Because of these, the wrath of God is coming. 7 You used to walk in these ways, in the life you once lived. 8 But now you must also rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips.

Colossians 3:1-2 & 5-8 (MSG) 1-2 So if you're serious about living this new resurrection life with Christ, act like it. Pursue the things over which Christ presides. Don't shuffle along, eyes to the ground, absorbed with the things right in front of you. Look up, and be alert to what is going on around Christ-that's where the action is. See things from his perspective....5-8 And that means killing off everything connected with that way of death: sexual promiscuity, impurity, lust, doing whatever you feel like whenever you feel like it, and grabbing whatever attracts your fancy. That's a life shaped by things and feelings instead of by God. It's because of this kind of thing that God is about to explode in anger. It wasn't long ago that you were doing all that stuff and not knowing any better. But you know better now, so make sure it's all gone for good: bad temper, irritability, meanness, profanity, dirty talk.

How We Change

#### **SCRIPTURE:**

Colossians 3:1-2 & 5-8 Matthew 16:24-27

### **Scripture Passages**

Matthew 16:24-27 (NIV) Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. 25 For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it. 26 What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? 27 For the Son of Man is going to come in his Father's glory with his angels, and then he will reward each person according to what they have done.

Matthew 16:24-28 (MSG) 24-26 Then Jesus went to work on his disciples. "Anyone who intends to come with me has to let me lead. You're not in the driver's seat; I am. Don't run from suffering; embrace it. Follow me and I'll show you how. Self-help is no help at all. Self-sacrifice is the way, my way, to finding yourself, your true self. What kind of deal is it to get everything you want but lose yourself? What could you ever trade your soul for? 27-28 "Don't be in such a hurry to go into business for yourself. Before you know it the Son of Man will arrive with all the splendor of his Father, accompanied by an army of angels. You'll get everything you have coming to you, a personal gift. This isn't pie in the sky by and by. Some of you standing here are going to see it take place, see the Son of Man in kingdom glory."

#### ► Head

Observe the text and the author's main points.

## ➤ Heart

Envision how the text—when applied —might transform your inner life in terms of your thoughts, attitudes, and behaviors.

#### ► Hands

Apply the text by moving from inward reflection to outward action looking for practical ways to live the text out in our lives to serve others.

#### Neighbor

Anyone in your life
—whether a friend,
colleague, family
member, classmate,
or literal neighbor—
to whom you can
show God's love.

## Read aloud the passages for this week.

- 1. What two realms does the Apostle Paul compare in Colossians 3:1-2?
- 2. Colossians 3:5-8 gives some clear instructions on how to refocus on Christ. What does Paul command?
- 3. Does the Matthew passage further that thinking? Explain.

- 1. How can we "set our hearts on things above"?
- 2. List examples in our culture that impede "setting our hearts and minds on things above."
- 3. If you feel comfortable, share a difficulty you have experienced in your journey of doing this?

- ☐ Being a believer requires that we submit to Christ's will in every aspect of our lives. Ask God to show you where you need to grow.
- ☐ Create a chart of your personal desires. Separate those that make you more like Christ and those that do not.
- ☐ Meditate on The Message version of Matthew 16:24-28 (MSG) from the Scripture passages above.

## Reaching Outward: Investing in Your Neighbors

- ☐ In your conversations with friends and neighbors, learn what tends to weigh them down. Find ways to support and encourage them.
- □ Is there something in your life you need to crucify? Something you need to deny because it is not of God? Bring this to the Lord. Then consider confessing this to a friend and asking them to pray for you as you seek to "let Jesus lead."
