Read these Scripture passages aloud:

Genesis 1:1 NIV

¹In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

Ephesians 1:7-10 NIV

⁷ In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace ⁸ that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and understanding, ⁹ he made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, ¹⁰ to be put into effect when the times reach their fulfillment—to bring unity to all things in heaven and on earth under Christ.

Matthew 6:9-10 NIV

⁹ "This, then, is how you should pray:

'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, 10 your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.'"



What is the Hope of Heaven? (5–10 minutes)

Summarize 3–5 points of the message of this video.

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Reacting to the Hope of Heaven (10–15 minutes)

- 1. What did you wonder about heaven as a child? As an adult? Did you think in heaven you would be sitting on a cloud playing a harp? Did you think of heaven as a place a long way away? A boring place?
- 2. Have you ever thought about heaven and earth as interlocking spheres of God's good creation and that Jesus is the place where heaven and earth meet like the temple in Jerusalem? What is your reaction to this idea?
- 3. What do you think about Wright's explanation of hell? He said that heaven and hell are not equal opposites. "Hell" is the tragic result of a person saying, "No" to God's new reality. It is a state of existence separate from God where people become less human and more like the idols they worship.



Living the Hope of Heaven (10–15 minutes)

We continue to consider, as people of hope, having confidence in the hope of heaven, how we can be moved to action and bring hope right where we live today. What are some practical implications for our world, our community, and our lives? How is Jesus our model?

1. What do you learn about the connection and overlap of heaven and earth (God's space and our space) from Ephesians 1:7-10? Tell about a time when you felt heaven and the presence of God close to you, overlapping into this world.

- 2. In Matthew 6:10 Jesus tells us to pray, "Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." What can we do to help the kingdom of God enter into our daily lives in one or more of the following areas?
 - Our lives
 - o Our communities (family, work, neighborhood, church)
 - The world
- 3. Spend time discussing and planning a small group service project (ideas, time, location) that will bring heaven to earth.
