# MINUTES OF THE SESSION THE FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF HOUSTON, TEXAS June 21, 2022

The June Stated Meeting of the Session began at 6:00pm in the Fellowship Hall. Dr. Jim Birchfield called the meeting to order with a quorum present.

The Session members gathered around Rev. Andrew Stepp, laid hands on him, and prayed for him, his family and for his new ministry. The Session thanked Andrew for his service to God here at First Presbyterian Church and that we were sending him to Mandarin Florida with much love. Andrew then thanked the Session for the time he and his family have spent at First Presbyterian Church for the past 15 years.

#### **OMNIBUS MOTIONS**

The following omnibus motion, provided to Session in advance of the meeting, was duly adopted:

• Resolved, that the submitted Session Meeting Minutes May 17, 2022, be approved.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS AND UPDATES**

#### Finance

#### Steve Oldham

May was \$396k in contributions, \$467k in total revenue for the month. Expenses for the month were \$534k, a negative variance of \$67k. We finished May with ~\$4m cash on hand, with \$750k remaining in capex commitments from previous projects. We expect to finish June with \$3m, \$2m above our cash reserve.

- The Youth and Children Ministries will report to Caitlin Rhodes-Karahadian.
- As of July 1, 2022, Lisa Belus will serve full time as the Human Resources Director.
- Erin Varnell will become the Administrative Assistant to the Senior Pastor.
- There will be a small training for Elders to be empowered to serve communion in the worship service in the Grand Hall beginning the middle of July.
- The August Session Meeting will focus on
  - o A set of Progress Markers.
  - o Metrics
  - o A Year Long Calendar

These items will be the subject of the Fall Session Retreat.

- There will be a focus on "Here to Serve 2.0" from mid-August to the 1st Sunday in October. The Stewardship Giving emphasis will be asking the congregation to "Fund the Vision." There will be a luncheon to share with the congregation "Where your money is going."
- Jim Birchfield distributed an email from the co-executor of the Dunagin estate describing an estate gift of \$3 million dollars and that it is to be used in the "Here to Serve Campaign".
- Jim Birchfield shared a power point presentation of "Tracking What Matters." Tracking membership attendance, in person and on-line, vs giving trends. Are we tracking the right things the right way? Attendance is more than people in the pews, it includes those online and other vital

groups whose participation cannot be tracked by counting heads in a worship service. Giving trends seem to indicate that the current reduction in giving may primarily be an 'asking' problem...i.e., the Session/Pastors have not, as yet, outlined the new/continued vision and asked for the congregation to support that vision.

#### ACTION (DISCUSSION) ITEM

Steve Oldham/Hunter Johnson

- The 2023 Budget was presented which included a chart describing the different actions approved in 2021-2022 that add funds to the 2022-2023 budget delineating them from increases to the 2022-2023 budget coming from actions to support the four priority pillars. This was followed by a period of questions and answers. Time was given for those who wished to speak for and against the approval of the budget.
- A motion was made and approved, with two objections, to accept the proposed 2023 Budget of \$10,823,010.

Communion was served by intinction by Rev. Jim Birchfield and elder Brent Dorsey.

The meeting adjourned at 8:45 with the singing of the *Doxology*.

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# **Governance Committee Report**

The Governance Committee did not formally meet in July or August. However, the committee was represented at an ad-hoc joint meeting of Finance and Governance requested by Pastor Birchfield and held in his conference room on July 25th. At this meeting, two matters were discussed, and proposals agreed, that would require approval by the full Governance Committee and, ultimately, by Session.

• A proposal will be made jointly by Governance and Finance to Session to make a change to the configuration of Session committees under the current governance model. It was proposed by Finance, and agreed by Governance, that an additional Session Elder from the first-year Session class be added to the Finance Committee as a non-voting member. This change would reduce by one the number of Session Elders assigned to the Community Life Committee. It was felt that this change is needed because, for purposes of continuity, such an important committee as Finance should have representation from all three Session classes. The Session Committee configuration presented in the Governance Manual will be revised to reflect this change. The Advisory Committee will determine which first-year Elder will be moved over to Finance for the 2022-2023 year.

- All voting members of the Governance Committee affirmed agreement with this proposed change via email ballot on August 4th.
- It was also agreed that our governance documents should be revised to clarify that the area of risk management will fall under the purview of the Governance Committee. This will involve revising the Governance Committee Charter to reflect this additional responsibility. A Risk Management Team will be appointed who will report ultimately to the Senior Pastor through the Chief Operating Officer, and the Governance Committee will provide Session oversight of that Team.

Both of these proposals will require changes to the Governance Manual which will ultimately be presented to Session for final approval. Those changes will not be finalized in time for the August 16<sup>th</sup> Session meeting but will hopefully be ready for final action by Session in September.

## What is going on in your ministry and how is it going?

- Chancel Choir Director Search
  - We are regrouping and refreshing the search
  - We are now expanding the job description to allow for the possibility of a full-time position
  - We are reflecting on our paradigm while pragmatic issues are very important, we are taking a breath to agree in principle and practice that we are first and foremost seeking the person God desires to lead this ministry at FPC.
  - As time has passed, in conversation with Pastor Jim Birchfield, Jim has addressed the committee and choir with his recommendation that since we have capable leadership in place, that it now seems to make the most sense to discern our future in consultation and synergy with the new Senior Pastor.

- The New 8:15 Service we are working with Communications in generating vision and enthusiasm around this service. A rough sketch of the description:

  Where the historic and the contemporary come together and the rich repertoire of the Christian tradition is embraced: past, present, and future.

## What is going on in your ministry and how is it going?

- VBS At the start of the summer we invited almost 400 campers and volunteers to experience God's love in a fully immersive way! From FPC kids to Presbyterian School; Nehemiah Center to grandkids of members, our building was full of laughter and fun all week! Our camper's learned about God's Monumental love through large group worship, special songs, hilarious skits, tasty snacks and fun games. Many families and church members volunteered to spend time with our kids and their help was invaluable. They created relationships with our kids and their families and proved that we are a church who serves even the littlest among us. VBS is an evangelical tool that introduces many families to our church. It is impossible to pull off without the help of the FPC staff, church leadership and lay leaders/volunteers. We were so grateful for their "buy in" and are already looking forward to next year when we can minister to even more families!
- VBS Camp Mission for Preteens was a week filled to the brim with fun, friendship, and faith building. The kids had the opportunity to really dig into the Joseph story through crafts, scenarios, and snacks it was really impressive how they were able to put themselves in his shoes and imagine what he felt like in different seasons of his life. The highlight of our week was going to the Houston Food Bank where we got to serve shoulder to shoulder as we filled bags of rice and boxed up the filled bags.
