ENVISION HOW THE TEXT—WHEN APPLIED—MIGHT TRANSFORM YOUR INNER LIFE IN TERMS OF YOUR THOUGHTS, ATTITUDES, AND BEHAVIORS

- 1. How did Paul seek unity among different cultures and perspectives when he talked with church leaders about the circumcision issue? How is this a model for us when there are potential points of disagreement between Christians?
- 2. Think about how you would prepare for a meeting that could have a generational impact. How does Paul's choice of Barnabas, a Pharisee convert, and Titus, a younger church-planting Gentile pastor, to join him for an important meeting with the Jerusalem apostles, help you decide who you would bring with you?

APPLY THE TEXT BY MOVING FROM INWARD REFLECTION TO OUTWARD ACTION LOOKING FOR WAYS TO LIVE THE TEXT OUT IN OUR LIVES TO SERVE OTHERS

Reaching Upwards: Growing in Your Relationship with God

- Jesus calls, equips, and sends his servants. In what ways are you called, equipped, and sent? Ask the Holy Spirit to show you how to fill any gaps.
- In 1:15, Paul says that God set him apart from his mother's womb and called him by His grace. How does it resonate with you that you were set apart from your mother's womb and called by God's grace?

Reaching Outward: Investing in Your Neighbors

- Paul uses a simple way to explain his conversion: (1) before he met Jesus (v. 14-15), (2) when he met Jesus (v. 15), and (3) now how his life is different because he knows Jesus. Use this outline to draft a brief "elevator speech" about your conversion answering the following questions: What were you like before meeting Jesus? When did Jesus find you? Now, how is your life different? Practice this in your small group, and look for opportunities to share this with others, especially non-Christians.
- Pray through the ALPHA prayer points (listed above) this week.

Reaching Beyond

- The passage this week concludes with the recounting that James, Peter, and John encouraged Paul, Barnabas, and Titus to remember the poor. In what ways are you remembering the poor on a regular basis?
