Alpha Prayer Points

- Fall morning Alpha concludes December 21. Pray that in these last weeks that the eyes of the blind will be opened and that those who were in the dark will see the light of Christ.
- Pray for energy, strength, and spiritual protection for those participating in and serving with Alpha, and for all to be led by the Spirit.
- Continue to pray for the Holy Spirit to work in the hearts of those who came to Spring 2023 Alpha and who are meeting now in twice-monthly post-Alpha groups. Pray that as they learn and experience Spiritual Practices, they would feel drawn to the love of Jesus.

How Did it Go?

10 Minutes

PROVIDE SUPPORTS, ENCOURAGEMENT, AND ACCOUNTABILITY TO ONE ANOTHER FOR PUTTING THE WORD OF GOD INTO PRACTICE. TOGETHER, FIND WAYS TO LIVE OUT THE SCRIPTURE.

- What from the study last week were you able to put into practice this week? For example, did you make it a habit to "do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers" (Gal 10:6)?
- Did anything get in the way between you and living out the word of God that you studied last week? If so, what? How can you intentionally plan to counteract that this week?
- Have you taken the opportunity to invite someone you know to an advent activity?

Passage for this week: GALATIANS 6:11-18.

OBSERVE THE TEXT AND THE AUTHOR'S MAIN POINTS

- 1. Paul goes to great lengths to show that this communication is from him in Galatians 6:11. Why is this important to him? To us?
- 2. What is the motivation of the people who want to compel believers to be circumcised?
- 3. In what subject is it appropriate to boast according to Paul? What would that look like?
- 4. Discuss how Gal 6:15 sums up Paul's argument in Galatians.
- 5. Galatians is one of Paul's last letters. In what ways might Paul's body bear "the marks of Jesus" (Gal 6:17)?

15-20 Minutes

ENVISION HOW THE TEXT—WHEN APPLIED—MIGHT TRANSFORM YOUR INNER LIFE IN TERMS OF YOUR THOUGHTS, ATTITUDES, AND BEHAVIORS

- 1. Looking back over the sermon series and study of Galatians, what lessons will stay with you? How has the study of Galatians impacted your life? How do you plan to keep its message alive in your life? Discuss this with your small group, and incorporate these thoughts into your prayers and actions this week and after.
- 2. Do any of your words or actions imply boasting in something other than the cross? If so, how? What can you do to resist this temptation? As you discuss, ask the Holy Spirit to help you to identify and resist this temptation.

• Slowly re-read Galatians several times in the next few days and weeks. Ask God to impress on you the insights He wants you to remember and what He wants you to give attention to as a result of this study. Then sit quietly and listen to God.
