Look Back

10 Minutes

- In his sermon on February 18, Pastor Curtis said that some Christian leaders encourage marriage like it is the highest goal for a Christian. How does this do harm? What is the highest goal of a Christian?
- The vice and corresponding virtue last week were lust and chastity. What are ways that you lean away from lusts and lean into a chaste heart and mind?
- How are you using this Lenten season as an intentional time for spiritual growth?

Read Aloud

1st Timothy 6:9-18

Head: Observe the text and the author's main points

15–20 Minutes

- 1. What happens to those who chase riches over God's kingdom?
- 2. What does Paul say to pursue instead of riches?
- 3. How does Paul describe the holiness of Jesus Christ?

Heart: Envision how the text—when applied—might transform your inner life in terms of your thoughts, attitudes, and behaviors.

15–20 Minutes

- 1. How has the pursuit of wealth or esteem led you or someone you know to stumble?
- 2. How does God's holiness as described in verses 13-16 impact your concept of trust in Him and generosity towards others?
- 3. What does it look like to live out Paul's charge in verses 17-18? Do you think an outside observer would see you as dependent on God and living generously? Why or why not?

Hands: Apply the text by moving from inward reflection to outward action looking for ways to live the text out in our lives to serve others 10 Minutes

Reaching Upwards: Growing in Your Relationship with God

- What limits your reliance on God? Discuss with your small group. As a spiritual exercise, each day this week, ask the Holy Spirit to reveal something that limits your reliance on God.
- How has God surprised you with His generosity? Share ways God has been generous with you. This week write down a list of three ways you can be more generous in your daily life in light of what God has done for you.
