

Romans 8:31-34

More Than Conquerors

31 What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? **32** He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? **33** Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. **34** Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us.

Questions

1. What is something that stood out to you about this passage? Is there anything that was confusing to you?
2. What does it mean that God is *for you*? (v.31)
3. How has God shown that he is for us? (v.31-32)
4. Have you ever felt like God was not for you? What made you feel that way?
5. The passage says that with Jesus, God will freely give us “all things”. What does “all things” mean? Is there anything God won’t give us?
6. What does a life that fully trusts God in all things look like?
7. What does it mean that Jesus is interceding for us? (v.34)
8. What is the greatest challenge or threat to your faith right now? How does knowing God is *for you* change the way you view this?
9. Spend time in prayer.
