Week Six

Look Back at Last Week

- In his Sermon on May 5 about the church in Sardis, Pastor Emmanuel warned against a a religiosity that is performative, but not personal. Discuss ways to nurture a personal rather than performative relationship with Jesus.
- When in seminary Pastor Emmanuel had a trusted mentor observe that he (Emmanuel) was good at talking about God, but challenged whether he was drawing closer to God by deepening his prayer life. What person or people in your life challenge you in this way?
- Discuss whether it is easy or difficult for you to think of yourself as beloved, as someone in whom God takes great delight.

OBSERVE THE TEXT AND THE AUTHOR'S MAIN POINTS

- 1. How is Jesus characterized to the church in Philadelphia? What seems especially significant to you? For "key of David," see Isaiah 22:22.
- 2. The word, "open" is used three times in verses 7 & 8. How do the following verses help clarify what "open" and "open door" mean: 1 Cor. 16:8-9; 2 Cor. 2:12; Col.4:3?
- 3. What is the result of following the counsel of Jesus in verse 12?

Heart | 15-20 Minutes

ENVISION HOW THE TEXT—WHEN APPLIED—MIGHT TRANSFORM YOUR INNER LIFE IN TERMS OF YOUR THOUGHTS, ATTITUDES, AND BEHAVIORS

- 1. The church in Philadelphia had "little strength" (v.8), but still could be used powerfully by God. Peter walked on water although he only had "little faith" (Matt.14:28-31). Jesus said that nothing is impossible for those who have faith as small as a mustard seed (Matthew 17:20). What encouragement do you take from these verses? Where could you lean into your little strength, your little faith more?
- 2. In verse 8 Jesus notes the opportunity for the church: "an open door that no one can shut." Discuss open doors available to you and what you are doing with them. Who or what can help (v.7-8a)?

Reaching Upwards: Growing in Your Relationship with God

- The church in Philadelphia lived in an unstable environment because of frequent earthquakes and aftershocks. What instability are you facing? To what or to whom do you look to in unstable times? Why is it important to keep your eyes fixed on Jesus during such times?
- What is significant about the image of being "a pillar in the temple of my God" (v. 12) for those in an earthquake prone area? For us?
