Look Back at Last Week

- In his sermon on Esther 4:1-17, Pastor Curtis mentioned that the movie, Forest Gump engages the question of destiny and free will. How have you wrestled with these seemingly contradictory possibilities?
- Respond to the question Pastor Curtis posed, "What is your royal position at this time?" We might phrase it, "Who is in my circle of influence?" or "How can I serve God in my current circumstances at home or outside the home?" or "How can I be a person that God uses?"
- How is Esther a signpost to the true Esther, Jesus?

Read Aloud

Passage for this week: Esther 5:1-14

Head (15-20 Minutes)

OBSERVE THE TEXT AND THE AUTHOR'S MAIN POINTS

- 1. Verse 1 refers to the "third day." Look back at the end of Chapter 4. To what is this referring?
- 2. Describe the emotions Esther may have felt as she stood in the inner court of the palace (v. 1).
- 3. What are Haman's character qualities and flaws in v. 9-14?

Heart (15-20 Minutes)

ENVISION HOW THE TEXT—WHEN APPLIED—MIGHT TRANSFORM YOUR INNER LIFE IN TERMS OF YOUR THOUGHTS, ATTITUDES, AND BEHAVIORS

- 1. Discuss how you feel about Esther's approach to winning the king over by starting with small requests. How useful is that approach today?
- 2. Explore how courage, faith, and trust can sustain us during challenging times.
- 3. Read Proverbs 16:18 and Proverbs 29:23. Reflect on the dangers of pride and its consequences.

Hands (10 Minutes)

APPLY THE TEXT BY MOVING FROM INWARD REFLECTION TO OUTWARD ACTION LOOKING FOR WAYS TO LIVE THE TEXT OUT IN OUR LIVES TO SERVE OTHERS

Reaching Upwards: Growing in Your Relationship with God

- First discuss and then thank God for the evidence in your life that God is leading and guiding you through people, events, open and shut doors, etc.
- What are practical ways to resolve conflicts wisely?
- How do we deal with excessive pride in ourselves and others?

Reaching Outwards: Investing in Your Neighbors

- The book of Esther reveals a person, Haman, who despises the Jews. He acts to eliminate them as a people group and even personally plans to kill Mordecai. Where do we see that kind of hate in our world today? What is behind it? How are Christians to respond when they witness hate in the world?
