

WEEK TWO | CULTIVATING COMMUNITY

LOOK BOCK

10 Minutes

- On September 8, we started a new sermon series, On Mission to explore FPC's mission, values, strategy, measures, and the vision for the future. Pastor Curtis preached on our unique calling based on Ephesians 2:1-10.
- How do you feel about FPC's new mission statement: "Cultivating community in the way of Jesus for the flourishing of the city"? What do you especially like about it? What makes you feel ambivalent about it?
- How would you describe your mission? How can you discern the good works God has prepared for you?
- What does it mean to you to be called, "God's handiwork" in Ephesians 2:10?

Read Aloud

Genesis 1:26-2:4 & Acts 2:42-47

Head

Observe the text and the author's main points (15–20 Minutes)

- 1. What kind of work does God perform before the seventh day? What work does God assign to people in Genesis 1:28?
- 2. God rested on the seventh day. What else does He do in verse 2:3?
- 3. What happened in Acts 2:42 and what followed as a result?

Heart

Envision how the text—when applied—might transform your inner life in terms of your thoughts, attitudes, and behaviors (15–20 Minutes)

- 1. In Genesis God gives people work as co-laborers. In Acts, how does cultivating community in light of that charge relate to how we cultivate community today? What are we missing?
- 2. One commentary states "contemporary religious life is plagued by momentary enthusiasm, periodic outbursts, and superficiality." What do you see as distractions to living out your faith in community?
- 3. What consistency can you draw from the community in Acts 2?

Hands

Apply the text by moving from inward reflection to outward action looking for ways to live the text out in our lives to serve others (10 Minutes)

Reaching Upwards: Growing in Your Relationship with God

- There are four actions listed in Acts 2:42: (1) teaching,(2) fellowship, (3) breaking of bread, and (4) prayer. Which one(s) do you feel least engaged with today?
- Which one(s) do you feel most engaged with today?
- Pick one of the four actions and commit to a response such as joining a Sunday School class or prayer group. Discuss with your small group.

Reaching Outward: Investing in Your Neighbors

- Do you have any neighbors in need or who need community? Find a way to demonstrate the generosity displayed in Acts to your neighbor with your small group such as hosting a prayer gathering and meal (maybe a pot-luck?). Discuss as a group what you have done in the past, what you would like to do, and what you will do.
- Invite seekers into Christian community by inviting them to Alpha. Pray for morning Alpha that begins October 31 from 8-9 AM in the Solarium. This Alpha is focussed on but not limited to Presbyterian School parents. We need volunteers to help and people to attend.
