## PREPARATION FOR WORSHIP

## CALL TO WORSHIP

Let us call one another to worship, reading from Isaiah 55 together.

"Praise My Soul..." is a poetic (metrical) setting of Psalm 103. In this case the tune was written to be sung with this hymn (text). The tune bears the latin name, lauda anima, which means, "praise (my) soul."

**Anthem:** From Psalm 119—C.V. Stanford composed much sacred choral music in Victorian England. A man of his time, Stanford's compositions can be grand and dramatic. But for this treatment of Psalm 119:1, the music is serene and concise. In old music theory the triad (three-note chord) is the kernel from which all music grows. Stanford employs this foundational idea by separating the men and women into two choirs, each singing three-part harmonies. These dueling triads trade back and forth, and then occasionally come together in a staggered ascending pattern. Small pieces like this are miniature artworks that inspire devotion in the heart and mind of the listener. Rather than an overt appeal to emotion, they creating an ambience, and bedding of color where the text resides and invites us to meditation.
