

WEEK THREE | COME AND SEE

LOOK BOCK

10 Minutes

- Discuss these two questions Pastor Curtis raised in his September 15 sermon on Cultivating Community:
- What part of this city are you rooted in for work, home, recreation? What would it look like for you to be on mission for Christ in these locations right where you are planted?
- How are you experiencing the gift of community? Where do you find community in this season of your life? Who could you invite to join you?
- Pastor Curtis said that if we do not glorify God, we are not a church. How we do so may be different from other churches. What are ways FPC glorifies or can glorify God different from other churches?

Read Aloud

John 1:35-42

Head

Observe the text and the author's main points (15–20 Minutes)

- 1. Who are the main characters in this passage? What are their roles?
- 2. What is the importance of what John the Baptist calls Jesus?
- 3. How do the disciples respond to Jesus' invitation to "come and see"?

Heart

Envision how the text—when applied—might transform your inner life in terms of your thoughts, attitudes, and behaviors (15–20 Minutes)

1. What emotions do you experience when hearing Jesus' invitation to "come and see"?

- 2. Talk to your small group about when you became a follower of Jesus and how it has impacted your life. Who was an Andrew to you? To whom have you been an Andrew?
- 3. In verse 38 Jesus notices two disciples following Him and asks, "What do you want?" James K.A.Smith says that "Our wants reverberate from our heart, the epicenter of the human person." What is the condition of your heart? What does your heart want from God?

Hands

Apply the text by moving from inward reflection to outward action looking for ways to live the text out in our lives to serve others (10 Minutes)

Reaching Upwards: Growing in Your Relationship with God

- What steps can you take this week to follow Jesus more closely like the disciples did?
- Notice that the disciples were curious (asked questions), took action (followed Jesus), and listened to Him all day. Which one or more of these characteristics (curiosity, taking action to follow Jesus, listening) would help you to grow closer to Jesus? What will you do about it?
