Love Divine All Loves Excelling: This classic Charles Wesley hymn, so well liked by generations of Christians, is both personal and transcendent—a combination of opposites. It is one of the best devotional texts ever written. It is addressed to Jesus Christ, who is "love divine", God's love in human flesh who as the "joy of heaven" came down to earth to find a "humble dwelling" in human hearts. The prayer is for spiritual maturity, for sanctification by the Holy Spirit, and for completeness of salvation ("Alpha and Omega"). Then we pray for God's ongoing creative, restoring work in us, looking forward to the day when all things will be made new—"ever changing from glory to glory"; one day heaven and earth will acknowledge

him as Lord.

Almighty God, we pray for your blessing on the church in this place. Here may the faithful find salvation, and the careless be awakened. Let us worship the One who brings peace and healing to our souls.


We lift our voices in praise, for God's love is our strength and our song.


We join our voices in the prayer of praise:




